

SERC BOARD OF DIRECTORS PROGRAM COMMITTEE REPORT


OCTOBER 19, 2022

In collaboration with the CSDE Bureau of Special Education, SERC continues to design and coordinate all of the special education programming to support educators, leaders, and families on behalf of students with disabilities for the 2022-2023 year.

- The 2022-2023 listing of all Special Education trainings to support the work of the Bureau of Special Education continue to be posted to the SERC Professional Development calendar and the CSDE Events calendar on a regular basis for educators to register for. <u>https://ctserc.org/events</u> and <u>https://nic.trumba.com/</u>
- SERC and the RESC Alliance cadre of trainers will continue to provide IEP quality training through the 2022-2023 year. This summer, trainings for district educators on the new CTSEDS IEP data system took place as a TOT model to bring the information back to their district colleagues.
- The Bureau of Special Education Back to School event for all district Directors and Supervisors took place in person on September 9 at the CT Convention Center. It was a great success as well as being in person again after being virtual for the past two years.
- SERC will continue to be a critical partner with CSDE to support the Attendance and Engagement, Alternative Schools, Charter Schools, and the Turnaround Office programming work for the 2022-2023 school year.
- SERC continues to be responsive to support the CSDE with any requests for project coordination/facilitation/technical assistance to support their efforts on behalf of students, educators, and families.


Below is a snapshot of our 2022-2023 Special Education Programming supporting the Bureau of Special Education by topic from July 1, 2022-September 30, 2022

<u>Update on African American, Black, Latino, and Puerto Rican Course of Studies</u>

- September Quarterly focusing on Semester 1 Units 4 and 5 was well attended and received as evidenced by participant feedback. Presentations by content experts and Lesson Spotlights by teachers who implemented course last year continue to be highlights.
- School-based coaching has begun with initial focus on supporting teachers with pacing plan for course as there are many different schedules and programs implementing across the state this year, including alternative high schools, specialized programs, and adult ed.
- The course received international attention at Pacific Education Group's Summit in Washington DC last week where the SERC Team presented on the history of legislation, curriculum development process, and implementation feedback and experiences from students and teachers.
- Extended professional learning opportunities such as VIP Days for implementing teachers with Discovering Amistad while in port in New London and Middletown concluded this week. Invitation only viewing of Civil War film and discussion will take place this month.
- Centralized purchasing of Book Bundles with Barnes and Noble is well underway providing districts with significant quantity discounts, ease of purchasing, and automatic shipment of second set from CSDE/SERC for school/community library access.
