

## In collaboration with the CSDE Bureau of Special Education, SERC continues to design, coordinate, and implement all special education programming to support educators, leaders, youth, and families throughout the 2023-2024 year.


## Special Education Programming supporting the Bureau of Special Education July 1, 2023 – October 31, 2023 Snapshot of IDEA Activities by Project

- The SERC team is presenting on November 6, 2023, at the Pacific Educational Group National Summit in Austin, Texas. Our topic is: "Pa'lante! Creating and Affirming Student Identity
- Planning for the Student Summit on December 15, 2023, at CCSU is underway in partnership with the CCSU African American Studies Department.
- Quarterly Training and Coaching will resume for Cohort 3 December 7 8, 2023

### **Other Programming Updates**

## • DMHAS School-Based Center for Prevention, Education and Advocacy ("The Center")

- SERC, in collaboration with DMHAS, surveyed all school districts to gather and share information regarding the prevention programs that Connecticut school districts are implementing around mental health, suicide prevention, substance use prevention, and social-emotional learning. The survey covered which programs are being used, the impacts of the programs, and prevention priorities for districts.
- 50 districts completed the survey, and outreach to these districts began to coordinate services and programming, including the development of an online Canvas course called *Universal Opioid and Other Substance Use* Prevention Planning
- Outreach to school districts continues with the start of the new school year. Bi-lingual brochures and posters are being sent to school districts.
- The SERC Library serves as a central repository for substance use prevention curricula and school-centered, evidence-based programs, resources and tools for K-12 educators

### • English/Multilingual Learner Programming

- New Podcast series titled *Learning with Multilingual Students* where we hear from immigrant-origin students in Connecticut about their experiences and perspectives. Educators working to recognize, engage, and extend the linguistic resources of English Learner classified students will also be featured.
- The first episode is launching in late October and will feature newlyarrived immigrant students at a New Haven high school sharing their schooling experiences in Connecticut and future goals. Bilingual school leaders provide context about successes and challenges.

### • SERC Quarterly Newsletter

 With support from Graustein and The Narrative Project, SERC will launch thefirst of its quarterly newsletters in late October, highlighting resources, events, activities, and opportunities.

#### • National Summit for Courageous Conversation®

 SERC will be represented at the 13th Annual National Summit for Courageous Conversation® in Austin, Texas, from November 5-8, 2023.
 The Summit is an excellent opportunity for racial equity leaders from across the nation to convene and engage in deep conversation about race and its impact on opportunity and achievement for all.

#### • Cultivating Meaningful Partnerships: Equity @ the Center

 SERC supported the CSDE on September 30, 2023, for an equity symposium to explore the relationship between superintendents and their diversity, equity, and inclusion leaders as they work collaboratively to create an equitable educational environment. It was a very successful event, with over 80 educators in attendance.
